On Saturday, May 30, 2015, thanks to Palm Beach philanthropist Lois Pope, American Humane Association, celebrity animal advocate Beth Stern, and a consortium of rescue groups, nearly 200 animals who had been in imminent danger of being euthanized found a new lease on life. On this bright and sunny morning a squadron of 10 airplanes flown by volunteer pilots departed Greenville, Alabama bound for airports across Florida. Each pilot carried with them animals destined for forever homes in Florida. Of the 200, 60 dogs and six cats landed at North Palm Beach County Airport and were greeted by a host of AHA supporters including Lois Pope and Beth Stern.





The Red Star Rescue Team and two fully equipped 50-foot Red Star Rescue trucks underwritten by Mrs. Pope were integral to the rescue. Pilots n' Paws is the volunteer organization of private aviation pilots who carried the animals to airports across Florida, including Palm Beach County, Tampa, and Orlando. A Second Chance Puppies and Kittens Rescue is the Royal Palm Beach-based volunteer pet foster group who will use its foster network to find temporary and permanent homes for the animals. Petco Foundation donated muchneed supplies for the animals.

And of course the story has the happiest of endings because the animals all found loving, forever homes.
