General George S. Patton, Jr. is one of the most illustrious military figures in U.S. history. Known for his fierce determination and his ability to lead soldiers, Patton first etched his name in the annals of great war heroes as the commander of the Western Tank Force, the only All-American force landing for Operation Torch, the Allied invasion of North Africa. From there, he led the Seventh Army invasion of Sicily and then the Third Army after the invasion of Normandy. By the time the World War II was over, the Third Army had conquered or liberated more than 81,000 square miles of territory, as well as the infamous Buchenwald concentration camp.
