There, the work of Magen David Adom, the country's official emergency medical services operation, is truly 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Its 33,000 emergency medical technicians and paramedics mobilize a fleet of 2,000 ambulances, Medi-cycles, helicopters, and other emergency vehicles to try and save every man, woman, and child possible.

That translates into hundreds of thousands of lifesaving cases every year, and not just what we may consider typical – heart attacks, births, vehicular accidents, animal bites, household falls, gun shots, and the like. Contrary to here at home, MDA must also respond to situations we consider unimaginable -- terrorist actions, from bombings and rocket fire to suicide-mass casualty attacks.

And if that were not enough, MDA also collects and processes hundreds of thousands of blood donations on an annual basis. Plus, it helps many countries during natural disasters, lending its experience and expertise in the aftermath of earthquakes, tsunamis, and other extreme weather tragedies.

What I especially admire and respect about the organization – and why it is a primary beneficiary of my generosity – is that MDA offers its myriad services to all people, regardless of faith, religion, ethnicity, race, gender, nationality, or political affiliation. Her desire to save lives locally and in Israel are just two examples of her extraordinary humanity and kindness."

I will always remember those words and that party, and hold them dear to my heart. Now, I am joining the AFMDA to officially dedicate my 16th ambulance – this one in honor of a truly remarkable man, Moti Ferder, the recipient of the 16th ambulance, and in tribute to our longtime friend Tova Leidesdorf.

Dog parenting tips from LIFE friend Lloyd Schiller

1. Thunder and lightning storms, along with fireworks 'celebrations', panic our dogs. They tremble and pant. One of the things we have found calms them down, and allows them to sleep, is our Amazon Music Echo Dots ('Alexa - play') and the program, "Smooth Jazz for Pets."

We also sometimes use: "Sentry Calming Ointment for dogs," which is applied sparingly to their noses. It's easy to use and seems to work like a mild tranquilizer.

2. Our oldest rescue, and total tomboy, is Gabby. She's about 11 now, and for the past year we noticed she was often reluctant to "Go Outside" or "Walk" or take part in the outdoor activities she used to love.
