The heartwarming image was posted by <u>Redditor</u> <u>puglife123</u> last week with the comment: 'This woman comes to my local humane society and sits in front of the dogs cage and reads books to the dogs.' The kind volunteer has since been identified as Sandy Barbabella and she's a regular at the Western Pennsylvania Humane Society in Pittsburgh, where puglife123 also volunteers.

She reads to the dogs once a week, on a Tuesday, to help them feel less lonely, and to provide comfort. The image touched many online. 'That's a good person right there' wrote one person. Another added: 'I just started crying. I don't know what my emotions are doing, but this is amazing.'
